I am so excited to be directing *Modern Girls in Bed*. The cast of seven diverse women creates a unique opportunity for women in theatre. I haven't seen anything like this on stage in years!

When you take five progressive and iconic women from our history and throw them into bed with two young women of our own time, a clash in values occurs. We meet these 'Strong Women' at a time of great vulnerability for each of them, in the most intimate of domestic spaces: the bed. We explore the bed as a place of rest and retreat, dreaming and scheming but also confinement - as anyone who has experienced enforced bed rest will know! *Modern Girls in Bed* is a genuinely hilarious, terrifyingly relatable and moving portrait of what it means to be 'strong' and what it takes to keep getting back up again.

Far from revering them to the point of oversimplifying, as history often does, our play embraces our historical heroes flaws, pretensions, outdated values and all to create a complex and epically engaging sisterhood of brilliant, but tired, leaders.

I last directed *Constellations* by Nick Payne at Circa and I can't wait to bring this new work to the Circa stage and share it with you, just in time to celebrate 125 years of women's suffrage in New Zealand!
