Introductory notes for The Coven on Grey Street

# **The Theatre Space.**

As you enter Circa 2, the stage is to your left. The raised, fold-down seating is to your right.

## The Set.

As you sit facing the stage, in front of you is an exterior scene in what is the patio of a wealthy New Zealand home. Right at the back, in the middle of the stage is a Pohutakawa tree with a thick trunk and branches laden with flowers, spreading wide across a flagstone patio. To the right side of the tree, as you face the stage, is a wooden picket fence framing the patio as it reaches out to the end of the stage. Halfway along, it is overlapped by a second picket fence which comes downstage at an angle, framing the set and creating an entrance indicating a driveway that leads off the patio area. To the left of the Pohutakawa, as you face the stage is the back door to the house, set in a purple weatherboard wall, with a small white deck and a step down to the patio. On the patio, centrestage, is an oval dining table covered in a white embroidered tablecloth, with four chairs around it. There are flowers and plants in beds and pots scattered around.

All this gives the impression of a cosy and often used outdoor seating area.

# **The Characters** (in order of appearance)

There are four characters in this play.

## Daphne, a witch.

Daphne is the middle child of the 3 Weird Sisters. She is tall and slim, with shoulder length silver blond hair cut in a feathered style. She appears to be in her mid 70s. When she first appears, she is wearing a mid calf length, flowing dress in a pale pink, with ruffles and pleats, and covered in a design of flowers. She has sandals on her feet and an engagement ring on her finger. She is a peacekeeper, a dreamer, an optimist and trusting. Her energy is light and fluttery.

#### Ted, a human.

Ted is Daphne's fiancée. He is a little taller than Daphne and is comfortably plump. He has silvery white hair around a bald pate and kind eyes. He appears to be in his mid 40s. He is a lecturer at Waikato University, and a secret Shakespeare nerd. When he first appears, he is wearing casual dark blue trousers and a blue and red checked long sleeve shirt with the cuffs rolled up. He wears a watch on his left wrist and black shoes. He also has a dark blue

apron around his waist and a tea towel flung over his left shoulder. His energy is impish and jolly.

## Fay, a witch.

Fay is the youngest of the 3 Weird Sisters. She is also the shortest. She has a slim build, and very short silver white hair. She appears to be in her mid 70s. She wears a mid calf length loose and wavy sleeveless dress with swirly patterns in retro brown, orange and white, over a full length shirt of deep brown. She wears chunky drop earrings and her glasses are on a chain around her neck. Fay is the joker of the family, opinionated and filled with disdain for ageing and all that comes with it. Her energy is forceful and strong.

# Sybil, a witch

Sybil is the oldest of the Weird Sisters. She is average height, very slim, with silver blond hair cut in a fringe on her forehead and swept up into a messy bun at the back. She appears to be in her mid 70s. She is dressed all in black- trousers, top, jacket and boots. When she first appears, she is wearing sunglasses, and a cast on her left hand. The cast is black as well. The sunglasses come off pretty soon after she arrives. Sybil is a hermit at heart and does not like being made to go to social occasions. Her energy is stubborn and judgemental.
