



WRITER'S NOTE

Thank you for taking the time to come to the theatre and experience this play together. It means a lot to be supported when times are tight for so many New Zealanders. This script took about five years to write because I got lost along the way. It stayed in the digital drawer of my Google Docs because I couldn't figure out the proper ending for these delicious characters. It was the encouragement of a friend who emboldened me to pick it back up and discover the ending it deserved. Thank you Michael for the gentle push. The adventures of Sybil, Daphne and Fay and the University lecturer Ted were an absolute joy to write once it all clicked into place. I absolutely loved seeing the same joy in the rehearsal room as every member of the team picked up the challenges of the script and made them their own. The dance of everyday conversation I've written is deceptively difficult but Harriet and the cast have found the nuances of the Weird Sisters and Groom superbly, evoking the 6000 years of history between them in glances and tone that has me in stitches and moved in equal measure. I'd like to thank the whole team for their incredible work and for bringing a vivid, fantastical world to life in a way that I never could've imagined. Ultimately the play is about family: about who you choose to invite into your life and the love and pain that comes with it. and the family you're born into, where immense love mixes with the herculean effort of just trying to get along. I'd like to thank my own family for always being there for me, for their love and support and modeling empathy in all that you do, and to my partner Cassandra for all the everyday kindnesses and endless encouragements, the first to read a draft and most honest with feedback. The silliest best friend and my absolute rock. Finally, to our familiar Charles for always weaving around my legs, showing your love with the simple act of touch.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

There's something about a powerful woman that is grating to some people. Something about a woman enjoying herself too much, having too much independence, asking too many questions. No matter where we're at in history, there's always someone trying to press their boot onto our necks, whether it's burning us at the stake or taking away our access to affordable and safe reproductive healthcare. This is my second magic-themed play here at Circa Theatre, but spells and prophecies are less interesting to me than the power they imbue their caster with. What happens when a woman cannot be killed? What happens when she outlives all her persecutors? What kind of person does she become after thousands of years of forging her own destiny outside of the expectations of society? What drew me to this script was the chance to inhabit the inner workings of three of the most powerful women in history, and delve into their thoughts, feelings and desires as they exist separate from how they've been represented by men. (And, of course, the chance to let three fabulous actresses shine.)

I want to thank James Cain for trusting me with his script, Conrad Newport for always being a step ahead of everyone else when it comes to believing in me, Ange and Rob Bickford for giving me a safety net when I needed it the most, my "Polycule" for making me feel like I deserve the things that I want, Jayne Ramage for refining and perfecting my feminine rage, and most of all my Mum, who remains the most terrifyingly powerful woman I have ever met.
